



Authors Guidelines: Poster Presentation

The poster session will take place on Wednesday, April 8th, from 1:50pm to 4:05pm.

The poster presentation is divided into two parts:

1. Short presentations (1:50pm-2:40pm):

- Please be in the respective meeting room at least 10 minutes before the session starts.
The short presentations will take place in two sessions in two different meeting rooms.
- All posters will be presented by authors in a short 2 minutes presentation. Therefore, you should prepare 2 PowerPoint slides that summarise your work.
- There will be a strict time management by the session moderator.
- Please seat yourself in the front row of the meeting room to be able to quickly walk to the podium - there will be chairs reserved for the poster presenters in the first row.
- You will talk in the order of the numbers assigned to the posters, which you will be able to see in the printed final programme.
- As a guideline for your 2 slides, we recommend the following:
 - use the two minutes to give the audience an incentive to come to see your poster
 - strictly avoid explaining details/results of your work because you will not have the time for it (the results can be discussed later at the poster)
 - you should outline the content of your work and explain why it is relevant
 - Why should people visit you at the poster?
 - What could they learn?

2. Poster session (2:45pm-4:05pm):

- The stands will be available by 8am on Wednesday, April 8th - please place your poster on the poster stand until 1pm.
- Each poster stand has a number (that you can find it in the printed final programme) - the number, which corresponds to your poster number, is your poster stand.
- You should remain at your poster during the entire poster session to avoid participants visiting a poster and not being able to find the author.

Further guidelines:

- The available useful space for your poster is 96 cm (width) x 145 cm (height). We recommend using A0 portrait format.
- The posters should inform in headlines about:
 - the purpose of the work;
 - experimental and/or theoretical approach;
 - results and conclusions.
- Please use illustrative graphs and tables and avoid lengthy text.
- It would be helpful for delegates, if you could include in your poster presentation a photograph and email of the authors.
- Staff will be available to help you attaching them to the board. The required material for that will be available.
